CORAL BLEACHING: A LOOMING THREAT: RISING OCEAN TEMPERATURES, CAUSED BY CLIMATE CHANGE, ARE THE PRIMARY DRIVER OF CORAL BLEACHING. WHEN STRESSED BY HEAT, CORALS EXPEL THEIR ZOOXANTHELLAE, LEADING TO A LOSS OF COLOR AND, IF PROLONGED, THE DEATH OF THE CORAL. BLEACHING EVENTS HAVE BECOME INCREASINGLY FREQUENT AND SEVERE IN THE CARIBBEAN, RESULTING IN WIDESPREAD CORAL MORTALITY AND ECOSYSTEM DEGRADATION.

THE IMPORTANCE OF REEF CONSERVATION: PROTECTING CORAL REEFS REQUIRES A MULTIFACETED APPROACH, INCLUDING REDUCING GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS TO MITIGATE CLIMATE CHANGE, MANAGING COASTAL DEVELOPMENT TO PREVENT POLLUTION AND SEDIMENTATION, AND COMBATING OVERFISHING TO MAINTAIN THE DELICATE BALANCE OF THE REEF ECOSYSTEM.
